

Literacy

Recounts. Non-fiction texts based on Explorers around the world. Historical character profiles and WANTED posters. A range of poetry. Setting descriptions and stories. Reading stories from other cultures. Postcard writing from places around the world (linking to our history topic). Diary entry writing from alternative perspective. Instructions based on Bonfire Night.

Numeracy

Place value. Comparing numbers using more and less symbols. Number bonds to 20. Addition and subtraction facts. One step multiplication and division problem solving. Position and direction linking with fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$. Measurement: length, height, mass, weight, capacity and volume. Coin unit of measurement £ and p.

Science - Squash, bend, twist and stretch. Changing materials. Performing simple tests. Understanding if changes are permanent or reversible.

Plants and animals: identifying common and wild plants. Looking at deciduous and coniferous trees

Computing - E-Safety.

Digital footprint and online safety. How to protect ourselves and our personal information. Kind and unkind behaviour online.

PSHE - Anti bullying

Anti-bullying workshop. Recognising different types of bullying. Kind and unkind behaviour. Recognising how our actions affect others in and out of school.

Geography - My local area and places around the world.

Key features of the UK and Europe. Hot and cold places around the world. Comparing climates. Identifying weather patterns in the UK.

Music - Pulse and rhythm.
